Less than a year ago, Dave had high rent arrears, was struggling with the condition of his home, plus there were some safeguarding and domestic abuse concerns. The fear and anxiety was impacting on his health, leaving him in a very dark place.

Now he is paying his bills on time and in full, and he continues to improve where he lives. From regularly breaking down and being very upset before the support, to now having more confidence and leading a much happier life.

Dave credits this turnaround to the support he has had from us and other services.

He said: "The support from Sunita and Jo brought me back from wanting to end my life. I couldn't see any way out before, but they have been like a pair of guardian angels and deserve the highest recognition for what they've done for me."

I can now hold my head up high and be proud of who I am.

Want to get into work?

Extra funding has been given to continue two employment support projects until March 2023.

Our Building Better Opportunities MOVE (Lincs) and BBO Humber projects support people who are unemployed into work.

We provide one-to-one support in a range of areas – developing basic skills, confidence building, work experience, training opportunities, interview techniques and much more. The funding will allow us to support a further 90 people – people like Sarah who has recently gained full-time work after support from BBO.

She said: "I moved to the local area after suffering domestic violence, and that had really impacted on my confidence and future aspirations.

"However, everything soon changed. I did a range of training to increase my skills, and each session was made personal to me which helped to improve my self-belief.

"Before I knew it, this job opportunity came up and it's perfect."

None of this would have been possible without the support, and I now feel like my life can begin again.

Celebration time

We have recently completed and officially opened the first specialist dementia care scheme in our area.

Myos House, located on Warwick Road in Scunthorpe, will enable residents to receive support and live with their families, avoiding the unsettling move to residential care.

The development is made up of 25 two-bedroom apartments and a communal area for residents. It has dementia-friendly features throughout including decoration, furniture, assistive technology and 24 hour on-site care and support provision.

More than £3million of funding was provided by us for Myos House, with an extra £1million from Homes England and approximately £300,000 from North Lincolnshire Council.

Sharon Ross, a family member who has moved into the scheme, said: "This is going to help families as those with dementia will be able to experience activities, mix with others and have people who they can relate to."

It's nice to know that there are people here that can be on hand at any time, so now when I'm working I don't have to worry.

We hosted the official opening ceremony at the start of September to celebrate. Nine-year-old Jessie Stocks cut the ribbon after winning the competition to name the scheme.







Aday in the life of... Barrie

Our new Sustainability & Carbon Reduction Manager.

What does your role involve?

To make Ongo more sustainable and reduce our carbon output. This covers the energy we use, our fuel consumption, and making our homes as carbon neutral as possible.

Can you explain about our environmental focus?

We are aiming to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2050. This doesn't mean no carbon emissions at all - instead, it's about balancing it out.

It won't be an overnight fix, but it's something that we all have a part to play in.

What work will take place?

One main thing is that we are looking to plant 2,000 trees.

We're also considering letting land grow to meadow. This will increase bio-diversity and bring in more wildlife. Furthermore, we're looking to electrify our fleet of vehicles in the future.

How can readers get involved?

By working together – not just with us but with your family, friends and neighbours too. You can help influence and be a part of environmental change that will have positive benefits for generations to come.

One way to do this is by becoming an Environmental Champion. To be eligible you need to live in one of our homes and want to help your community become an even better place to live.



Our new homes in Lincoln

We are now the proud landlord of 111 homes in a new-build neighbourhood near Lincoln city centre.

A London based landlord, Metropolitan Thames Valley, was seeking bids from other housing associations to take over the properties. From a range of interest, we were selected due to our high levels of tenant satisfaction.

Included in the development are shared ownership and leasehold homes, and they officially transferred to us at the end of September.

Bungalows completed

Eight homes have been built adjacent to Trent View House in Scunthorpe.

The two-bedroom bungalows all feature wet rooms, level access, their own garden, plus super-fast broadband installed. They have been funded by Homes England.

The space that these bungalows are built on was run down, so it's nice to transform this and offer a new opportunity for eight families.

Next step in regeneration

A project featuring 11 homes is about to start on Rowland Road in Scunthorpe.

This is another part of the transformation work that has taken place in recent years. Seven of the homes will be for affordable rent, with the remaining four part of the Rent to Buy scheme. They will be a mixture of two and three-bed properties.

Anew way of getting a home

We've officially launched our new online lettings platform, MyMove.

We will advertise up to **50%** of our homes on MyMove, with the remainder available on the local choice-based lettings scheme in place.

Housing need will still be the main factor when considering applicants on the platform, but a range of other factors will also be taken into account.

MyMove will allow you to search available homes based on your needs, bid for suitable properties, fill out applications and register for alerts.

Did you know? Our main tenant group, Community Voice, influenced the proposals for the platform and then approved it at their July meeting. Wider consultation was carried out with tenants, applicants for housing, staff and partner agencies.

MyMove will provide a quicker, fairer and more inclusive way of getting a home with us.



Your achievements

Paralympian medallist

One of our tenants became wheelchair bound and was on the verge of giving up on her archery dreams. Now, Victoria is the owner of a bronze medal after achieving third place at the recent Paralympic Games held in Tokyo, Japan.

She explained: "To quality for my first Paralympic Games, and to be able to represent my country and town (Kirton in Lindsey), was special enough but to win a medal made it even more memorable. Knowing I'd made so many people proud was the best feeling, and the whole experience was very surreal and amazing.

"It just shows that, even when you feel like everything is against you, good things are never far away."

Easy peasy sausage pasta

Feeds a family of 5 for £1.50

What will I need?

- 1 bell pepper
- 400g chopped tomatoes
- Penne pasta
- 100g frozen peas
- 1 chicken stock cube
- 2 tablespoons of oil
- 1 brown onion
- 4 sausages
- 5 mushrooms

Yummy! How can I make it?

- 1. Add the oil to a large wide-based pan over medium high heat.
- 2. Chop up your sausages into slices and add to the pan, stirring gradually until sausages are brown and cooked through. Remove sausages from the pan without draining the oil and keep to one side for later.
- 3. Dice your pepper, onion and mushrooms and add to the hot oil. Fry the veg until they begin to soften, then pour in your tin of chopped tomatoes.
- 4. Boil a kettle, dissolve your stock cube in a small amount of boiled water and pour this into your pan. At this point start cooking your penne pasta in a separate pan of salted water according to the packet instructions.
- Allow the sauce to start bubbling before adding in your cooked chopped sausages and frozen peas. Allow to simmer on a very low heat for a further 10 minutes.
- 6. Once your pasta is cooked, drain it and add to your sauce.
- 7. Plate up and enjoy!



TOP TIP: If your child prefers a smooth textured sauce, hide the veg even more by blending using a hand blender.

Being a part of digital improvements

Abrighter future

Tracey is the perfect example of doing great things in the face of adversity.

She has physical and learning disabilities, emotional struggles, a mental disorder, anxiety and past trauma.

Tracey has undergone counselling and confidence building through our mental health project, Ongo Talk, and has also received qualifications in areas such as First Aid and Health & Safety. Also, she is receiving support to achieve her lifelong ambition – to set up her own dog training business.

Tracey said: "The support from Ongo has allowed me to do the relevant online training, courses and exams, and they've helped me with registering the business and setting up a social media page.

"Kim and Barry (Ongo Talk) have been particularly great in making suggestions and helping to enhance my skills, but allowing me to show my own initiative too."

She explained: "At the start I couldn't make eye contact with anybody, my self-belief was very low and everything used to overwhelm me.

"Though I still have some struggles, they're nothing compared to before. If it hadn't have been for the support, then I wouldn't have had the confidence to do any of this."

This represents a remarkable change in Tracey from when she first began to get support.


